

VietnamRevisited

In January, 1971 I boarded a Continental Airlines flight in DaNang, Republic of Vietnam with no thought of ever returning to that place. I had just spent my one-year rotation in that country with the 1st Brigade, 5th Infantry Division (Mechanized), first as a cavalry platoon leader and troop XO, then as an assistant Tank Battalion S4 and finally as assistant S1.

I have been an affiliated member of the 12th Cavalry Association since about the inception of the Regimental System. In June of 2001 I became associated with A Troop 4-12th Cavalry Association Vietnam. We had our first reunion in September, 2001 at the Stardust Casino in Las Vegas, NV. Four years ago one of our members, Jim Good, reported on a tour to Vietnam and the purported cost was around \$5,000. I was not prepared to spend that much on a vacation for myself.

However the thoughts of returning to Vietnam began to intrigue me. In February of this year, Jim Good, sent me a brochure from Military Historical Tours in Washington, D.C. A 12-day tour "Steel Tigers Return" (1st Bn, 77th Armor) highlighting most of the areas in which we served, was being offered for \$3000. I was interested, but still leery of spending that much on a vacation for only myself. My wife, Rita, decided that she would like to go.

We made our reservations and made preparations to go. September 28th we headed for LA, and met the rest of the group, three leaders from MHT, 5 troopers, Jim Good, Dennis Patrick, Charlie Russell, Ray Garvi and myself from A, 4-12Cav, two Grunts from 1-11Inf, a marine from the 3d Marine Div, and 7 tankers from the 1-77th Ar. LAX to Inchon, ROK, change planes Vietnam Air to Hanoi, through customs and flight to Hue/Phu Bai. Three nights in Hue where Capt. Ed Garr, USMC, Ret guided us through the battle of Hue, Tet, 1968.

A bus trip North to Quang Tri Province LZ Nancy, LZ Sharon, Wonder Beach, Quang Tri Citadel, , Dong HA, Jones Creek, Gia Lin, brought a flood of memories to those who served some 38 years ago. Cam Lo, Fire base Charlie 2, Alpha -4(Con Tien), the Razor back, the Rockpile, Firebase Vandergriff, Camp Carroll, the Ba Long Valley, My Loc, Khe Son to the Lao border.

It was during this part of the tour we were joined by a Vietnamese gentleman introduced as COL Dzang Anh. He was the Viet Cong Chief for Quang Tri Province. His home is just East of Dong Ha. He spent most of a day with us as we toured these sites in his and our AO. We talked of some of the operations, but he couldn't remember specific incidents. Of course we were only there for a year. Anh was there for the duration. As we were trying to find the remnants of the combat base at Quang Tri, several of us walked about a mile down a dirt road. COL Anh told us we had gone too far. We were standing in an area where a VietCong Bde was camped. While we were discussing these ventures he presented me with a medal. We shook hands and saluted each other on the bridge over Jones Creek.

We headed South to DaNang stayed at a resort on China Beach, toured Marble Mountain, then flew North to Hanoi. We were given a briefing by the assistant Cdr of Detachment 2, Joint POW/MIA Accounting Command (JPAC), toured the Vietnam Army Museum, and the "Hanoi Hilton", where John McCain spent 6+ years.

Air to and From LA, all hotels and bus transportation, and about 80% of the meals were included in the price of the trip. Many of the servicemen on the trip exorcised demons on these LZs and Firebases. For myself, romping in the surf of the South China Sea at Gia Lin brought me back 38 years. I highly recommend this trip to anyone who served there. Military
